From the President...

General Assembly Testimony

On Wednesday, February 26, 2014, PTU President, Maribeth Calabro and Treasurer, Alex Lucini testified in support of several pro-education bills at the General Assembly Health, Education and Welfare committee.

Maribeth spoke in support of H7096 a bill that would create a cyclical teacher evaluation cycle for tenured teachers. Maribeth stated “teachers want to be evaluated but not at the cost of interfering with the important work of guiding instruction for our learners.”

Alex testified in support of H7095, a bill that would delay PARCC testing and the banning of high stakes tests as a graduation requirement. Alex stated “the goals of classroom teachers in RI are essentially the same, to raise the rigor of teaching and learning in classrooms and to prepare students for college or career.” Alex also stated that “H7095 supports these goals and will put us on the path to achieve them. Our students should not be subjected to the consequence of our past mistakes but rather a beneficiary of our future successes.”

There will be a Senate Education Committee hearing on Wednesday, March 26, 2014 at 4:30 p.m. to hear additional testimony on these bills. Teachers are encouraged to attend and testify. The Bills may be previewed at: <http://status.rilin.state.ri.us/documents/agenda-10151.pdf>

Robert G. Porter was a dedicated union activist from the time he joined his first AFT local in East St. Louis, Ill., until his death in 1991. For nearly four decades, the late AFT secretary-treasurer gave his all to championing the rights of working people, promoting civil rights, and ensuring that the union was a vehicle for helping members achieve justice. Since its inception in 1993, the Robert G. Porter Scholars Program has awarded more than \$500,000 to AFT members and their dependents to further their education and to help grow our union’s capacity to achieve our goals.

This year’s winners will be announced by June 30 and will be recognized at the AFT convention, July 11-14, in Los Angeles.

The deadline for submitting the 2014 application to the AFT is **March 31.**
